Things To Bring: All items needed for your own family's picnic, mozzie patch (if necessary)

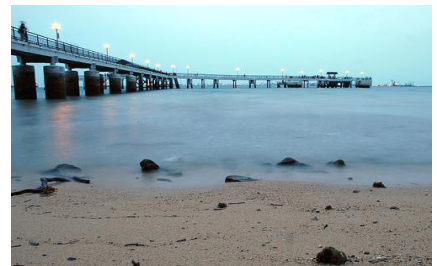

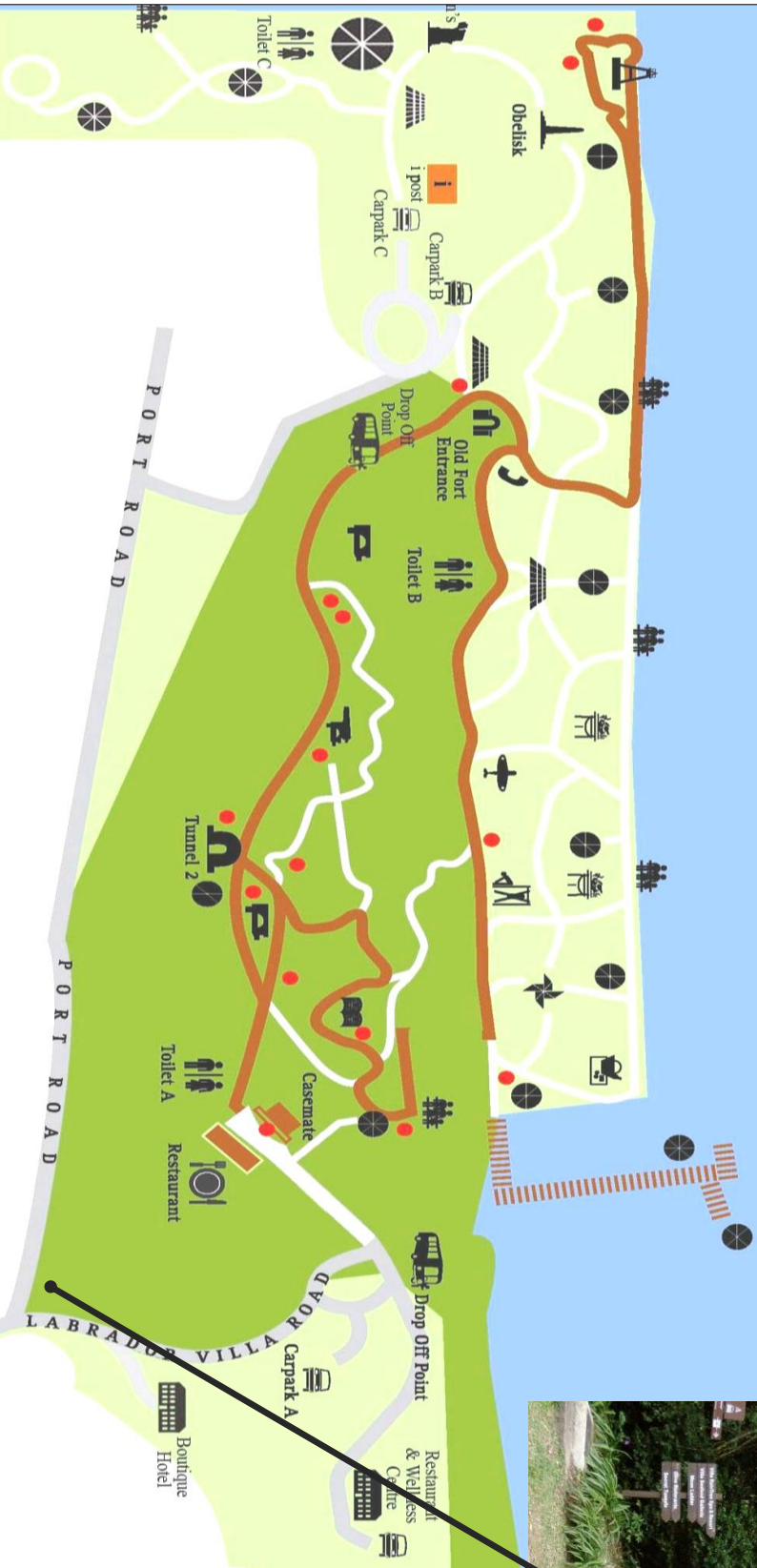
**HURRRY! REGISTRATION CLOSSES TODAY

HOW TO GET THERE:

Bus Services 10, 30, 51, 143 and 176. Alight along Pasir Panjang Road and proceed on foot via Labrador Villa Road. From Alexandra Road - Services 61, 93, 97, 100, 166 and 963. Alight along Alexandra Road (same side or opposite NOL Building) and proceed on foot via Labrador Villa Road.

TO GET TO CARPARK A:

Proceed along Labrador Villa Road until you see the sign in the inset picture. Turn right at the sign (1st right turn on Labrador villa road) and proceed right up to the top till you come to a small circus at the top where you see the Raintree Resort and Spa (a big white wrought iron gate) and carpark a next to it where we will be assembling.
