VIGILANCE AGAINST SCAMS

In view of increasing numbers of people getting scammed in Singapore, including some from *PSPC* – the Pastoral Team has approached Eld Wan Kum Tho to give us a short write up as to how we may be vigilant against scams from being perpetrated against us.

Vigilance against scams

Singapore is proud to be amongst the top in the world in many aspects. Unfortunately a recent Financial Times article has identified Singaporeans as one of the biggest scam victims worldwide for the last 2 years in a row. In 2023, Singaporeans lost the most money of any country at USD4031 per capita! There were 51,501 cases reported to police in 2024, with losses amounting to S\$1.1 billion. One person in the know was quoted as saying "Singaporeans are rich and naïve".

The situation can potentially worsen with the prevalence of AI generated voice and even images.

As good stewards of what we have been blessed, it is the responsibility for all of us to stay VIGILANT and look out for those around us.

Here are some basic preventive actions:

1. Be Mindful of Unsolicited Messages:

Don't Click on Links or Open Attachments from unknown or suspicious sources, especially if they are unsolicited. This includes appeals to help someone in trouble, often in the name of humanitarian aid or Christian missions. If you receive an appeal from someone claiming to be a missionary, please discuss with the Pastoral Team before acting.

Take your time and avoid acting immediately, even if the situation seems to be urgent, because scammers thrive on urgency.

You may use reverse image searches to see if the photos they are using are stolen or used elsewhere.

Verify Sender Identity. Double-check who sent a message or email, and be cautious of messages that claim to be from a trusted source but have suspicious URLs (remember an "O" can easily mistaken for a "0".

2. Secure Your Accounts and Devices:

Enable Two-Factor Authentication (2FA) for all your online accounts, which adds an extra layer of security beyond just a password.

Protect Your Devices by updating your operating system and security software to protect against vulnerabilities.

Only download applications from official app stores like the Google Play Store or Apple App Store.

3. Exercise Caution with Offers: If an offer seems too good to be true, it likely is a scam.

Again, don't Rush to Make Decisions: Take your time to evaluate offers and verify the authenticity of the sender before making any decisions.

4. Report Suspicious Activity: If you encounter a potential scam, report it to the authorities and the platform where you saw it. You can do so using the Singapore Government's official solution like ScamShield, which can installed on iOS or Android phones. It helps to screen out suspicious contacts, but it is not a perfect screen, the user still need to be vigilant.

5. Keep Your Passwords Secure: Use Unique Passwords: Create different passwords for different accounts. Avoid keeping passwords in easily accessible places like notes or applications.

6. Stay Updated on Scam Tactics: with the latest scam tactics and how to recognize them.

Consider Using Anti-Scam Tools: Singapore's Government Technology Agency (GovTech) offers solutions like the ScamShield app to help protect yourself.

7. Do not give away your personal particulars to unknown persons. If an unknown person asks you for your personal details, it is likely to be a scam. It is unlikely any government departments (or organizations for that matter) to call you to tell you that you are being investigated. Do not engage in conversation unless you are sure it is a person you know.

As extracted from the Singapore Police website. government officials will NEVER do these things over a phone call:

- Ask you to transfer money;
- Ask you to disclose bank log-in details;
- Ask you to install mobile apps from unofficial app stores;
- Transfer your call to Police

Similarly, as a church:

- the pastors, elders, deacons or church staff will not approach you privately to borrow money
- Do not trust any unknown phone numbers claiming to be calling from church
- If you are unsure, check with a trusted person in church first: eg, the Office Staff or the Pastoral Team.
- Check that the payee of any e-payment you make to Prinsep has the name Prinsep Street Presbyterian Church or Prinsep Street PC as payee before confirming the transfer

The above measures will not guarantee that you will not be scammed or targeted by scammers but it pays to be vigilant.

Biblical worldview and the meaning of man

About the Speaker: Rev Dr Malcolm Tan was a Methodist Minister for 40 years. He served in five Churches, three of them as Pastor in Charge: Faith MC, Barker Rd MC and Covenant Community MC. He earned his bachelor's degree from Trinity Theological College, MA in Asia Pacific Studies from the Dept of East Asian Studies, University of Leeds, and PhD from the Dept of Malay Studies, National University of Singapore, where he researched Protestant Missionary work among the Malay Muslim Community during Colonial Times. He was also a guest lecturer at TTC, where he taught Islam, Buddhism, and

Indian Religions. Rev Tan served the Boys Brigade as group chaplain of the ACS-based 12th Coy and was the National Chaplain of the BB for more than 10 years. He retired in Dec 2023 and continues to serve as a teacher of the Word, promoter of Christian missions and an evangelistic preacher.

REFLECTIONS

What Father's Day Means to Me

This Father's Day, the Pastoral Team is sharing a meaningful article by Scott, who recalls the significance of fathers who step up and shoulder the responsibility of fatherhood, especially from the perspective of being in the foster care system. By God's grace, he received the care he needed from a godly pair of foster parents, who became mum & dad to him, and his siblings. Praise God indeed!

Father's Day is to me is about being thankful to the men in our lives who take on the responsibility and obligations of guiding us through life. Most of the time, taking that responsibility begins at the birth of their child. But, sometimes God gives children their father through other paths.

When a man becomes a father, he takes on new obligations and expectations. I do not know this from firsthand experience, for I do not have any children. However, I have experienced the range of consequences of those responsibilities, *from being forgotten* to the *impact of when a man steps up and owns them*.

FATHER'S DAY AS GOD INTENDED

This holiday is a time to express to our fathers the gratitude we have for the sacrifices they made. It is a time to elevate our relationships with them to the forefront of our hearts and minds. God showed us the importance of this relationship clearly throughout scripture and capitalizing it in the Gospels. *It gives us an intimate view of the relationship between Christ, the Son, and God the Father*. Jesus gave thanks to the Father as an example to us. Father's Day is the time we designate to thank our earthly fathers and our Heavenly Father, just as our Savior did.

MY JOURNEY

To understand my perspective on Father's Day, you need to know a bit about my relationship with my father. Initially, there was no intention of him becoming my "father." He was the pastor of the church that sat across the street from our foster home placement in a small community outside of Birmingham. Before moving in with him and Mrs. Scott, we would occasionally meander across the street to attend services, especially when they were offering to feed us. So inevitably, we would come across the broad-shouldered, white-haired preacher with his red tie and pin-striped suit. The most well-dressed man I had ever met. He was (and is to this day) a fiery, passionate man in the pulpit, which made him seem like an intimidating, moral celebrity of sorts. At the time, I was a ten-year-old boy with no understanding of church culture or etiquette. To me, he was the equivalent of a school principal, but with God on his side.

A NEW FAMILY

Over the next year, my siblings and I began to attend more and more services. I remember one Sunday he was preaching a sermon and asked the congregation a rhetorical question. "When does a coal mine become a coal mine?" I raised my hand as I would at school and blurted out loudly, "When they find coal!" He was making a point about permits or something along those lines, but this interjection took him entirely off-guard. The congregation found this exchange to be hilarious, and that was the first time my future dad and I really connected. Eventually, our foster home could not continue to care for all of us. So, *he and my future mother took my siblings and me into their home when we were about to be placed into separate foster homes*. Thus began the journey of CB Scott becoming my dad.

INSTILLING CHARACTER

Over the next several years, he took on every obstacle of being the father I had never had. Before him, no man had ever shown me that he loved me and tried to build me into anything valuable. His goal was primarily to share with me the love of our Savior, then to provide the spiritual, emotional, mental, and physical resources to break the cycle of the broken families from which I came.

My father always said that he is "*in the man business*." By this, he meant that *he was determined to instill the character in me that I would need to be a strong man of God*. Without the efforts and sacrifices my dad made while raising me; I would likely have become another foster care statistic. According to the world, I was destined to be lost and hopeless. Instead, my dad shared grace with me and taught me how to do the same for my children one day. For this, I am eternally grateful.

BEING THANKFUL

Father's Day is about being thankful for the man or men in our lives *that stepped up and shouldered the responsibility of fatherhood for us*. It is about recognizing the sacrifices that those men made to be a good figure in our lives. We are called by God to love our fathers and mothers every day, but this holiday is specifically to recognize the role and impact fathers have. As followers of Christ, it is about being grateful to our Heavenly Father for those men.

FATHER'S DAY IS ESPECIALLY MEANINGFUL TO ME

Father's Day is especially meaningful to me. *I was on a path not to have a father to care for me or show me the love of God.* I was not supposed to have someone invest their time. To teach me the value of hard work and hold me accountable for my actions. I am so grateful for my dad, and I recognize I am so blessed to have him in my life. Not everyone has a man in their life that fills the father role in their life. *However, we all have access to the love and grace of Jesus Christ.* We can all unite in one Heavenly Father, and all be thankful to access to His love and guidance.
