

RE-ELECTION FOR SENIOR MINISTER (4TH TERM) REV DARRYL CHAN

Dear PSPC family, some of you might know that my older daughter Rachel turned 18 this year. At this milestone, a young person has reached the minimum age to learn how to drive, open an investment account and even consume alcohol. Of course, none of these is relevant for this write-up, if only for the fact that I started my ministry in PSPC in the very same year that she was born. If you had asked me when I first graduated from seminary whether I would still be serving in the same church after 18 years, I



would have found that quite unthinkable in an era of high pastoral attrition. Indeed, it is through the grace and mercy of God as well as your prayers and support that 18 years – including 12 years (3 terms) as Senior Minister – have come and gone, Yet despite 18 years being the third longest pastoral tenure in PSPC's history, I marvel at God's abundant supply of grace for Rev Benjamin Keasberry's 32 years (1843 - 1875) and Rev William Murray's 33 years (1902 - 1935).

Over the years, I have conducted the weddings of couples who used to be Prinsep Lighthouse (PLH) youths when I first started my ministry. Today, they still call me "Uncle" Darryl even though a number of them have gone on to become parents and whose children I have had the privilege to baptise. I have sometimes wondered what all these mean for an extended pastorate. I heard that at the entrance of an ancient church in France, there is a signboard urging people to enter the ministry. It says, "There are just four days in anyone's life: birth, confirmation, marriage, death. Would you not like to be one who would be needed on all four of those days?" Among the first cohort of infants whom I had baptised, some of them have started to join PLH. In a few years, I will be conducting their confirmation. Perhaps, if I live long enough, I may even conduct their wedding. But I have gotten ahead of myself.

The benefits and challenges as well as hits and misses of an extended pastorate have been well-documented. Just like the promises of a brand-new beginning, it is alluring to dream about how a pastor and a church can have a fresh new start. Yet I have often pictured my situation as though I am walking down a long corridor looking through the windows showcasing other Christian ministries, but with doors which are not meant for me. The only way forward is to continue down that long corridor that is PSPC. Thus, God has called my life, gifted my ministry and bound my vocation to His people here in PSPC – to know three, even four, generations of congregants and their families.

The Session has issued the call for me to undergo re-election as Senior Minister for the 4th term (2025 - 2029). I seek your prayers as this next term will involve the launch, implementation and completion of our Building Renewal Project (BRP). The leadership focus is to have a "Completed Building with Church Unity", "Renewed Building with Renewed Congregation" and "Larger Premises with Expanded Ministry". Together as staff, leadership and congregation, let us be "*Renewing Our Hearts, Building As One*" (PSPC Church Theme 2025). Amen.

Rev Darryl Chan is married to Angeline who is the Principal of Presbyterian High School. An educator at heart, she teaches English to domestic helpers in the HELLO Class. Their daughters, Rachel and Rebecca, are in the PLH. For psycho-spiritual wellbeing, they are not brought up as the stereotypical PKs (Pastor's Kids) or even Pastor's and Principal's Kids. Instead, they are raised as normal teenagers, with a normal childhood, in a normal family, by normal parents.

RE-ELECTION FOR ASSOCIATE MINISTER (2ND TERM) REV CHEAM WAN XIAN

Rev Cheam Wan Xian came to know the Lord Jesus Christ at the age of 12 and first sensed her calling to full-time ministry in her youth. She underwent theological training at Singapore Bible College (SBC) and graduated with a Master of Divinity (MDiv). Wan Xian is married to Rev Paul Tong and they have an adult daughter, Tong Xu Han.



PSPC Chinese Service

It was in 2016 that Rev Wan Xian was approached by Rev Darryl to come over to

PSPC as a volunteer to help start the Mandarin Service. In 2017, she joined the PSPC Pastoral Team and continued to prepare the Chinese Ministry to begin the Mandarin Service which was inaugurated on 7 January 2018.

Rev Wan Xian's primary responsibilities are the preaching of the word of God, coordinating the preaching calendar, pastoral and congregational care, evangelism and outreach, and serve together with the Core Team to provide leadership for the overall health and direction of the Chinese Ministry. She is also the Pastoral Advisor for Sarah Active Ageing Centre (SAAC). Rev Wan Xian is also presently a member of the Synod Women's Council.

Rev Wan Xian licensing was completed and accepted by the English Presbytery Exco on 19 May 2021. PSPC leadership had the privilege to witness her taking the Licentiate Pledge on 1 June 2021. She was ordained to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament and installed as PSPC Associate Minister on 11 September 2021.

Re-election as PSPC Associate Minister

In recognition of her faithful and effective ministry, PSPC Session issued the call to Rev Wan Xian to stand for re-election as Associate Minister to continue to grow the Mandarin Service. Together with the Core Team, she will continue to shepherd the flock, reach out to Chinese speaking seekers who have not yet had the opportunity to hear and believe the Good News of Jesus Christ.

CHRISTIAN CITIZENRY DURING A GENERAL ELECTION

A Pastoral Guidance for Prinsep Street Presbyterian Church (PSPC)

A. PREAMBLE

With the issuance of the Writ of Election, Singapore will be conducting the General Election on 3 May 2025. This pastoral guidance sets out how PSPC congregants can conduct ourselves as Christian citizens in a prayerful, discerning and respectful manner during the General Election.

B. A PRAYERFUL PROCESS

As Christian citizens of the country, we have the responsibility to "seek the welfare of the city... and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare (Jeremiah 29:7)." The GE is an especially significant time to seek the welfare of the country by committing the campaigning process and electoral outcome in our prayers.

C. A DISCERNING PROCESS

The Apostle Paul writes in Romans 13:6, "For because of this you also pay taxes, for the authorities are ministers of God, attending to this very thing." The nominees are campaigning to be elected as Members of Parliament and Political Office Holders whom Scripture recognises as "ministers of God". Therefore, we need godly wisdom to discern the calling, character and competence of nominees as we listen to campaign broadcasts and receive house visits so that we elect those who can best uphold and advance the welfare of the country.

D. A RESPECTFUL PROCESS

The Apostle Paul also writes in Romans 13:7, "Pay to all what is owed to them: taxes to whom taxes are owed, revenue to whom revenue is owed, respect to whom respect is owed, honor to whom honor is owed." A healthy and mature democracy allows the robust debate and contestation of ideas and opinions. In addition to the need for wise discernment, all exchanges of political views should be conducted fairly, truthfully and respectfully, especially with the prevalence of many online postings that may be biased, inaccurate or disrespectful.

E. CONCLUSION

Although Christians may hold onto differing views along the entire political spectrum, we need to remember that we are first and foremost brothers and sisters in God's family, members of the one body of Christ and united by the Holy Spirit in the bond of peace (cf. Ephesians 4:3). Our spiritual unity precedes, surpasses and outlasts our political differences – "Renewing Our Hearts, Building As One".

REFLECTIONS

Stirred, Not Lukewarm: A Wake-Up Call from Laodicea (Revelation 3:14-20)

Late last year, while studying the letters to the seven churches in Revelation 2 and 3, I was struck by how each church received praise followed by correction, except for one. Laodicea received no praise. Jesus could not praise them because they were neither hot nor cold, but lukewarm. He said He would spit them out of His mouth. That image is jarring – Jesus was disgusted by their apathy.

It made me reflect: what is my posture as I serve God? Or in worship? Am I just going through the motion even when serving in ministry? The question hit hard: Am I truly serving Him, or fulfilling obligations?

That sobering thought led me to pause and reflect on PSPC's future: Could the same fate befall PSPC if we grew complacent? I'm not saying that PSPC mirrors Laodicea, but the passage definitely serves as a reminder against settling into spiritual comfort or routine. Jesus longs for hearts on fire, fully alive to His call and purpose.

Laodicea also claimed, "I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing." But Jesus exposed their true condition: "wretched, pitiable, poor, blind and naked." That rebuke cut deeply. I've been brought up to be independent, to trust in my abilities and think critically. And I do. That is also what I value.

However, I've come to see how easily confidence can slip into pride – intellectual pride that can be dismissive of other perspectives and make one blind to correction.

On the seven churches, which were major cities and centres of trade during their heydays, where are they today? I believe only ruins remain. The imagery is stark when I visited Ayutthaya (former Siamese capital north of Bangkok) on a recent work trip, and I saw the ruins of the ancient kingdom. The ruins reminded me of the stark fragility of the world we live in, where the seemingly strong and powerful can be reduced to rubble. This is further reinforced when the tour bus passed the tall pile of rubble in Bangkok, which is all that remains of the recent tragic building collapse, where in moments, the modern building collapsed during a powerful earthquake. I reflected if I am resting on my own laurels, bringing the muscle memory of skills from the secular world into my service in church or am I truly being dependent on God? Are we striving to build His kingdom upon the confidence of our own knowledge, skills and resources or are we trusting Him to lead us as a church to further His kingdom and lay the foundation for future generations.

And yet, the beauty of Jesus' message is that instead of condemnation, it's a 100% loving invitation. He invites us to come to Him – to find true riches, to be clothed in righteousness, to see clearly again. He says, "Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline." What grace, that even in our lukewarmness, Jesus still knocks, still calls, still loves. Jesus' words remind me that unless I am convicted of my own sin, I am of no use to Him. To serve effectively, I must first be right with God, and then I must serve in dependence on Him, so that I cannot boast!

Thus, this stirs me. I don't want to live a life of casual faith. I want to be spiritually awake – not out of fear, but in hope. I am thankful that Jesus has called me, saved me and continues to be patient with me. The challenge is how to respond daily – to let Him lead in all things, serving from a heart that truly loves Him. And not to serve out of routine or obligation.

And this was reinforced recently, as Dr Peter Ho preached on Philippians 1 and encouraged us to walk this path of obedience as a community – stirred, not lukewarm – living lives worthy of the One who called us.

"Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving side by side for the faith of the gospel." (Philippians 1:27)
