VIGILANCE AGAINST SCAMS

In view of increasing numbers of people getting scammed in Singapore, including some from PSPC – the Pastoral Team has approached Eld Wan Kum Tho to give us a short write up as to how we may be vigilant against scams from being perpetrated against us.

Vigilance against scams

Singapore is proud to be amongst the top in the world in many aspects. Unfortunately a recent Financial Times article has identified Singaporeans as one of the biggest scam victims worldwide for the last 2 years in a row. In 2023, Singaporeans lost the most money of any country at USD4031 per capita! There were 51,501 cases reported to police in 2024, with losses amounting to S\$1.1 billion. One person in the know was quoted as saying “Singaporeans are rich and naïve”.

The situation can potentially worsen with the prevalence of AI generated voice and even images.

As good stewards of what we have been blessed, it is the responsibility for all of us to stay VIGILANT and look out for those around us.

Here are some basic preventive actions:

1. Be Mindful of Unsolicited Messages:

Don't Click on Links or Open Attachments from unknown or suspicious sources, especially if they are unsolicited. This includes appeals to help someone in trouble, often in the name of humanitarian aid or Christian missions. If you receive an appeal from someone claiming to be a missionary, please discuss with the Pastoral Team before acting.

Take your time and avoid acting immediately, even if the situation seems to be urgent, because scammers thrive on urgency.

You may use reverse image searches to see if the photos they are using are stolen or used elsewhere.

Verify Sender Identity. Double-check who sent a message or email, and be cautious of messages that claim to be from a trusted source but have suspicious URLs (remember an “O” can easily mistaken for a “0”).

2. Secure Your Accounts and Devices:

Enable Two-Factor Authentication (2FA) for all your online accounts, which adds an extra layer of security beyond just a password.

Protect Your Devices by updating your operating system and security software to protect against vulnerabilities.

Only download applications from official app stores like the Google Play Store or Apple App Store.

3. Exercise Caution with Offers: If an offer seems too good to be true, it likely is a scam.

Again, don't Rush to Make Decisions: Take your time to evaluate offers and verify the authenticity of the sender before making any decisions.

4. Report Suspicious Activity: If you encounter a potential scam, report it to the authorities and the platform where you saw it. You can do so using the Singapore Government's official solution like ScamShield, which can be installed on iOS or Android phones. It helps to screen out suspicious contacts, but it is not a perfect screen, the user still needs to be vigilant.

5. Keep Your Passwords Secure: Use Unique Passwords: Create different passwords for different accounts. Avoid keeping passwords in easily accessible places like notes or applications.

6. Stay Updated on Scam Tactics: with the latest scam tactics and how to recognize them. Consider Using Anti-Scam Tools: Singapore's Government Technology Agency (GovTech) offers solutions like the ScamShield app to help protect yourself.

7. Do not give away your personal particulars to unknown persons. If an unknown person asks you for your personal details, it is likely to be a scam. It is unlikely any government departments (or organizations for that matter) to call you to tell you that you are being investigated. Do not engage in conversation unless you are sure it is a person you know.

As extracted from the Singapore Police website, government officials will NEVER do these things over a phone call:

- Ask you to transfer money;
- Ask you to disclose bank log-in details;
- Ask you to install mobile apps from unofficial app stores;
- Transfer your call to Police

Similarly, as a church:

- the pastors, elders, deacons or church staff will not approach you privately to borrow money
- Do not trust any unknown phone numbers claiming to be calling from church
- If you are unsure, check with a trusted person in church first: eg, the Office Staff or the Pastoral Team.
- Check that the payee of any e-payment you make to Prinsep has the name Prinsep Street Presbyterian Church or Prinsep Street PC as payee before confirming the transfer

The above measures will not guarantee that you will not be scammed or targeted by scammers but it pays to be vigilant.

REFLECTIONS

The Great Commission – For Them & Us

Jesus issued His Great Commission as recorded for us in Scriptures in the Gospel of Matthew 28: 18 – 20 as follows, “¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.” (ESV).

Have you ever considered that the Great Commission is not only of benefit to those we are reaching out to, but also a gift to the Church too.

Who really benefit from the Great Commission? The unsaved, unreached or least reach people groups in the world do. They get the chance to hear the Good News, respond and experience the fulfilment of their spiritual emptiness with full reconciliation with God the Father by grace through faith, all made possible through the finished work of Christ on the cross.

But have you ever wondered why God entrusted the Great Commission to His people in His Church? Why not used angels? After all, God did use angels in the past to communicate His good news and with favourable effect too e.g. Luke 2: 8 – 14. And God will again use angels in the future as recorded for us in Rev 14:6.

However, in ‘this age’, in God’s infinite wisdom, God has opted to use frail human beings like you and I to get the job done. Why? Max W Chismon, who is the International Director of Living Springs International and the International Director of the Kairos Course and a missionary from New Zealand and has served in Asia for more than 30 years, offered up this view. He said angels do not need perfecting but we human beings do. He likened the Great Commission to a two-edged sword; not only do the unreached benefit, so do the reached. The unreached get reached and joins God’s eternal family, and the reached get perfected and mature in Christ.

Max says that the Great Commission provides a pathway upon which we can travel to become all that God intended us to become. It gives us the means to mature as disciples of Christ. When we embrace the Great Commission as a “commission” to be obeyed and not a “suggestion” to be discussed or considered, then the wheels of our transformation begin to turn. We transform from a self-centred, ‘what is in it for me’ person to a self-less bond servant of Christ. Our journey into Christlikeness and the true joy of being a disciple of Christ begins in earnest.

Max highlighted that Jesus taught on purpose, life and what it means to be His true disciple. He often would include direct references to the Great Commission. For example, in Mark 8: 34-35, Scriptures informed us, “³⁴ And calling the crowd to him with his disciples, he said to them, “If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow

me. ³⁵ For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. Jesus was addressing the 'crowd' and not just his disciples. This message was for every believer.

A further observation that Max made is that unity and collaboration cannot be separated from any definition of maturity. Jesus' high priestly prayer in John 17 and the description of a mature Church in Ephesians 4, trumpets loud and clear that unity in Christ is non-negotiable. The sheer scale and challenge of the Great Commission forces collaboration within the body of Christ and resulting in the unity in the Holy Spirit that is the hallmark of maturity in our Triune God. How great is our God and how marvellous are His works!
