

NOMINATION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS

During the ACM, we will be electing/ re-electing Elders and Deacons to serve in the Elders and Deacons Court (EDC). All communicant members are requested to undertake this nomination process with utmost responsibility and prayerfulness. The details of the nomination are printed in the Nomination Forms (Blue for Eldership, Red for Deaconship) which are available in the Fellowship Hall. Communicant members may also request for softcopy by contacting Mr Choo Wai How (Church Manager; <u>office@pspc.org.sg</u>).

Proposers are to approach Rev Darryl Chan (Senior Minister; <u>darrylchan@pspc.org.sg</u>) or Eld Andrew Aw (Session Clerk; <u>andrewawkianli@gmail.com</u>) <u>BEFORE</u> nominating a candidate so that they can explain the roles and responsibilities of an Elder or Deacon and clarify any queries. The nomination period is opened from <u>23 February – 23 March 2025</u>. Completed Nomination Forms – hardcopy or softcopy – must be submitted to the Senior Minister or Session Clerk by the deadline.

QUALIFICATIONS OF ELDERS AND DEACONS

The roles and responsibilities of Elders and Deacons are based on Scripture and PSPC Constitution. Thus, the nomination process ought to be undertaken responsibly and prayerfully. Prospective nominees ought to ensure that their faith and conduct are congruent with the qualifications set out in 1 Timothy 3:1-13.

A. Eldership

- PSPC Constitution 1.1.1 states that "The Senior Minister, the Associate Ministers and the Serving Elders, collectively, shall be responsible for the spiritual affairs of PSPC, which shall include the following:
 - (i) Preaching and teaching the Word of God;
 - (ii) Administering the Sacraments; and
 - (iii) Pastoral care and spiritual discipline of Communicant Members."


- 1 Timothy 3:1-7, "¹ The saying is trustworthy: If anyone aspires to the office of overseer, he desires a noble task. ² Therefore an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, sober-minded, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, ³ not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. ⁴ He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, ⁵ for if someone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he care for God's church? ⁶ He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. ⁷ Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil."
- There are many similarities in the biblical qualifications between an Elder and a Deacon, but the Elder has additional governing and teaching functions "overseer" (v.1) and "able to teach (v.2)". Therefore, prospective nominees for eldership ought to be men and women who are able to lead and teach.
- A Deacon must have served at least 1 term (3 years) to be eligible for nomination as an Elder.

B. Deaconship

- PSPC Constitution 9.1.2 states that "The Deacons shall work with the Senior Minister, the Associate Ministers and the Serving Elders in administering the ministries, the financial affairs and the activities of PSPC, in planning PSPC budget, in preparing ministry and financial reports and in managing all matters concerning ministries, finance and administration of PSPC."
- 1 Timothy 3:8-13, "8 Deacons likewise must be dignified, not double-tongued, not addicted to much wine, not greedy for dishonest gain. 9 They must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. ¹⁰ And let them also be tested first; then let them serve as deacons if they prove themselves blameless. ¹¹ Their wives likewise must be dignified, not slanderers, but sober-minded, faithful in all things. ¹² Let deacons each be the husband of one wife, managing their children and their own households well. ¹³ For those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus."
- Verse 10 says, "And let them also be tested first; then let them serve as deacons if they prove themselves blameless." PSPC leadership philosophy holds to the view and practice that the "testing ground" for prospective candidates should be in the context of their respective ministries or committees.

Therefore, let us nominate and elect men and women who fulfill the 3 'C's of leadership, i.e. those who respond to God's <u>Calling</u>, demonstrate godly <u>Character</u> and are able to serve with <u>Competence</u>.



CARBON FAST FOR LENT Week Focus: ENERGY & WATER (16 - 22 March 2025)

Reflection PAUSE BEFORE YOU CLICK by Dr Eileen Poh



Many of us shopped online during the COVID-19 pandemic. This trend continues today. We can purchase anything we want from any part of the world with a click on our computer or a tap on our phone. But have we paused to think about the environmental cost that each click makes?

A report estimates that 2023 saw the delivery of 186,000 parcels per day in Singapore, generating 15,900 tons of mailing packaging in that year.¹ The production of goods and packaging uses a lot of energy and water. We also need to think of the environmental cost of transporting these goods from different parts of the world to our doorstep.

The desire to acquire goods to satisfy our craving is not new. In Revelation 18:11-17a, John sees God's judgement on Rome's use of her wealth to acquire luxury goods for her self-gratification. Ships carried goods from all over the Roman Empire and beyond to Rome: precious metals and jewels, luxurious fabrics, expensive wood and metal, spices and perfumes, foods and wine, horses, carriages and slaves (vv. 12-13).

It is striking that this list of goods ends with slaves. Ian Paul remarks: "By including slaves at the end of the list, John is emphasising both ends of the chain of consumption: luxury and prosperity for the few has created poverty and oppression for the many."² This is true today. An example is the large number of women and girls working in slave-like conditions in garment factories, in third world countries like Bangladesh, to satisfy our taste for fast fashion.

While our online shopping may not include the luxurious goods listed in Rev 18:12-13, we need to reflect on the environmental and human costs when we click to buy something online. In this Lent season, let Isaiah's words guide us: "Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of wickedness, to undo the straps of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?" (Isa. 58:6).

Prayer

"Heavenly Father, forgive us for our mindless consumerism. Help us to buy goods that are produced in sustainable ways, and which provide a just and fair wage for those who make those goods. Amen."

Carbon Fast on Energy & Water

Focus on energy and water consumptions in our homes and workplaces:

- Consider using efficient appliances (e.g. LED lightings, water efficient taps etc.) and practice mindful consumption
 (e.g. switch devices off at the power sockets when not in use, perform half-flush of water whenever possible, turn off the shower/ tap when soaping etc.)
- Participate in Earth Hour (22 March, 8:30pm 9:30pm, you may consider switching off all unnecessary lights and electronic devices for one hour at home) https://www.earthhour.org/take-part/give-an-hour

REFLECTIONS

The Restoration of Prinsep Street Presbyterian Church Part 1 - What Children Can Teach Us Inspiration from Sunday School and the Book of Ezra

Sometime last year, our Sunday School children were asked to come up with drawings of what they wanted to see in our new church building. They were also tasked to build a 3-D model of the church. The drawings and models were amazing! The children were so creative and you should have seen the look of concentration on their faces as they built their "dream" church. There were so many variations – some had grass roofs with welcome signs whilst others had nice greenery and lots of shrubs and trees. Yet others had demon prisons, force fields and even a rocket to escape. No, we didn't teach these things in Sunday School!

The children had an opportunity to present their creations and there was a healthy respect for each other's concepts. They all took pride in their work, wanting to give their very best and there was a story behind their creations. Let me get back to this later.



Jonah & The Vision of Renewal

Before the children's activity, in August last year, Rev Darryl asked if I would consider being part of the Building Renewal Project Steering Committee (BRP but we affectionally call it BuRP). My immediate reaction then was no. I was after all quite happy serving primarily in the Children's Ministry/Sermonette Team and Website Ministry. I was also in Paris visiting my daughter. Far away. Easy to say no. But fortunately (or unfortunately) when I visited a church there, the story of Jonah coupled with the song "He Will Hold Me Fast" compelled me to say yes. I was also heartened to also see there were other brothers and sister (yes only one) serving in BRP – Eld Wan Kum Tho, Choo Wai How, Dn Lai Kian Fong, Dn Benjamin Smith, Dn Evelyn Ng and Rev Darryl. We have a common vision of renewal of the church building and I know they have the capacity to forgive me for my shortcomings.

BRP – Role & Function

The EDC has tasked BRP with a 3-fold purpose, including some warnings (always good to know what to look out for):

- 1. A completed project with united leadership It will be tragic if the BRP leads to the fragmentation of the church leadership.
- 2. A renewed building with renewed congregation It will be disastrous if the BRP brings about a renewed building, but the congregation does not grow in the theological virtues of faith, hope and love (qualitatively) and suffers from unnecessary numerical attrition (quantitatively).
- 3. A larger premises with expanded ministry It will be worthless if the BRP leads to a larger church premises but remains underutilized for ministry and outreach.

BRP seeks to take in the various inputs from Building Management Committee (BMC), Worship Committee and many others in scoping out Part 1 of the Sanctuary Restoration Works. Finally, BRP will liaise with the various consultants to ensure that the work is done in accordance with the inputs from EDC (Elders and Deacons Court) and that proper processes are followed.

Why Part 1 & Part 2?

What is Part 1 and is there a Part 2? Part 1 has to do with the Sanctuary. It's basically what we need to do to repair and restore the Sanctuary in line with what National Heritage Board (NHB) requirements. It also gives us an opportunity to refresh the look and feel of our Sanctuary so that it's fit for purpose for another 30 years. It envisaged that while Part 1 is unfolding in the Sanctuary, we will still be able to use the other parts of the church building. Part 2, which has to do with everything other than the Sanctuary, will only come later once the Sanctuary Restoration Works are completed. Akan datang!

Ezra's Story

This brings me to the book of Ezra. We're all quite familiar with the story of Ezra in the Old Testament and the role he played in rebuilding and restoring Jerusalem's temple after the Babylonian exile. His unwavering faith and leadership united the people in their mission to rebuild the temple, despite numerous challenges. But what struck me most about Ezra is in Ezra 7:10, "For Ezra had set his heart to study the Law of the Lord, and to do it and to teach his statutes and rules in Israel." Study, Do It and Teach. 1, 2, 3. A, B, C. Even as we embark on this project, let us be reminded to continue to Study God's Word, Obey it and Teach it to others (preferably in that order).


The Challenges Faced

Reconstruction is always messy, usually delayed and with costs overruns. It's no wonder that Ezra faced opposition from adversaries and struggled with the rebuilding! Ezra's challenges included skepticism and resistance from the people who had settled in Jerusalem during the exile, as well as external threats from neighboring enemies who sought to disrupt the rebuilding efforts. There were also bureaucratic obstacles imposed by the Persian authorities. Likewise, we too might face various hurdles as we embark on this project and need to be reminded of our objectives and stay united as a church.

Back to the Children

The children took the vision of the church renewal project seriously and with passion. They came up with 3-D models below. Similarly, BRP will work with the consultants to come up with some pictures or mockups to show how the refreshed Sanctuary might look like. We want to enhance the worship experience for our congregants and make the space more inclusive for everyone.

It is our prayer that we will come together as a congregation, forgive each other's shortcomings, and give space to hear each other out even if we cannot accommodate all requests.
