

NOMINATION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS

During the ACM, we will be electing/ re-electing Elders and Deacons to serve in the Elders and Deacons Court (EDC). All communicant members are requested to undertake this nomination process with utmost responsibility and prayerfulness. The details of the nomination are printed in the Nomination Forms (Blue for Eldership, Red for Deaconship) which are available via QR code and in the Fellowship Hall.

Proposers are to approach Rev Darryl Chan (Senior Minister / darrylchan@pspc.org.sg) or Eld Andrew Aw (Session Clerk / andrewawkianli@gmail.com) **BEFORE** nominating a candidate so that they can explain the roles and responsibilities of an Elder or Deacon and clarify any queries. The nomination period is open from **1 to 29 March 2026**. Completed Nomination Forms – hardcopy or softcopy – must be submitted to the Senior Minister or Session Clerk by the deadline (29 March 2026).

QUALIFICATIONS OF ELDERS AND DEACONS

The roles and responsibilities of Elders and Deacons are based on Scripture and the PSPC Constitution. Thus, the nomination process ought to be undertaken responsibly and prayerfully. Prospective nominees ought to ensure that their faith and conduct are congruent with the qualifications set out in 1 Timothy 3:1-13.

A. Eldership

- PSPC Constitution 1.1.1 states that “The Senior Minister, the Associate Ministers and the Serving Elders, collectively, shall be responsible for the spiritual affairs of PSPC, which shall include the following:
 - (i) Preaching and teaching the Word of God;
 - (ii) Administering the Sacraments; and
 - (iii) Pastoral care and spiritual discipline of Communicant Members.”

- 1 Timothy 3:1-7, “¹ The saying is trustworthy: If anyone aspires to the office of overseer, he desires a noble task. ² Therefore an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, sober-minded, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, ³ not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. ⁴ He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, ⁵ for if someone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he care for God’s church? ⁶ He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. ⁷ Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil.”
- There are many similarities in the biblical qualifications between an Elder and a Deacon, but the Elder has additional governing and teaching functions – “overseer” (v.1) and “able to teach (v.2)”. Therefore, prospective nominees for eldership ought to be men and women who are able to lead and teach.
- A Deacon must have served at least 1 term (3 years) to be eligible for nomination as an Elder.

B. Deaconship

- PSPC Constitution 9.1.2 states that “The Deacons shall work with the Senior Minister, the Associate Ministers and the Serving Elders in administering the ministries, the financial affairs and the activities of PSPC, in planning PSPC budget, in preparing ministry and financial reports and in managing all matters concerning ministries, finance and administration of PSPC.”
- 1 Timothy 3:8-13, “⁸ Deacons likewise must be dignified, not double-tongued, not addicted to much wine, not greedy for dishonest gain. ⁹ They must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. ¹⁰ And let them also be tested first; then let them serve as deacons if they prove themselves blameless. ¹¹ Their wives likewise must be dignified, not slanderers, but sober-minded, faithful in all things. ¹² Let deacons each be the husband of one wife, managing their children and their own households well. ¹³ For those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus.”
- Verse 10 says, “And let them also be tested first; then let them serve as deacons if they prove themselves blameless.” PSPC leadership philosophy holds to the view and practice that the “testing ground” for prospective candidates should be in the context of their respective ministries or committees.

Therefore, let us nominate and elect men and women who fulfill the 3 ‘C’s of leadership, i.e., those who respond to God’s **Calling**, demonstrate godly **Character** and are able to serve with **Competence**.

About 35% of Matthew's Gospel is not found in the other synoptic gospels. In this overview, we will examine a few of these passages. What did Jesus mean when he said to Peter, "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church" (Matt. 16:18)? We will consider three parables found only in

- Matthew's Gospel:
- the parable of the workers in the vineyard (20:1-16)
 - the parable of the two sons (21:28-32)
 - the sheep and the goats (25:31-46)

We will also look at Matthew's passion narrative and the resurrection account of Jesus Christ. Finally, we will sum up Matthew's Gospel by looking at the names he uses for Jesus: the Messiah, the Son of David, and the Son of Man.

Digital Ministry Survey 2025 Summary Report

A church-wide survey was conducted from 12 October to 9 November 2025 to help us assess and enhance the effectiveness of our digital presence in the following 3 areas: expanding online reach, deepening online fellowship, and administering online Communion. The survey was directed at PSPC congregants, not to the general public. A total of 230 responses were collected, though not every question was answered by all respondents since most questions were optional to complete.

Expanding Online Reach

77% of survey respondents attend on-site worship services weekly. Those who do not attend on-site worship services weekly do not necessarily replace their on-site attendance with online live-streamed worship services. This shows that online services added to people's engagement rather than replaced their on-site attendance. The most common reason cited by respondents who do not attend on-site services weekly on why they watch live-streamed services was convenience (36%), followed by being sick/homebound/caregivers (34%). Most (51%) see value in coming on-site to experience church community and attend worship services or church/ministry events.

Most respondents first knew about PSPC through non-digital means, with only 9% coming to know about PSPC through the website or YouTube live-streamed services. These results do not indicate that our digital platforms are ineffective in bringing newcomers to church, but are expected for our demographic where most grew up in church. The most appealing digital content drawing people to PSPC were online worship and/or sermons.

Most felt that our website (81%) and YouTube live-stream (90%) were very effective or effective in terms of online reach. At the time of the survey, our social media platforms were newly launched with little content posted at that time. As such, fewer respondents felt that they were effective (61-62%). The majority of respondents (about 82%) felt positive or neutral about our website's aesthetics, content and functionality. However, we recognise that survey respondents are mostly our members (not newcomers or visitors) who may use the website for specific purposes and are already familiar with its layout.

Regarding the next connectivity tool which might be useful to enhance the church's digital reach, the main choices were TikTok (28%) and Podcast (24%). The top few types of suggested content include those showcasing church life, ministries and sermons.

Deepening Online Fellowship

Respondents, by and large, agree that connecting through digital platforms for various activities (such as partaking in online Communion, attending cell group meetings or prayer meetings) provides some sense of community. They generally recognize that digital connection is better than having no connection at all, but should not be a replacement for in-person connection. However, some respondents also had concerns about complacency and lack of effort to physically meet if these digital options are available to members. These concerns appear valid as convenience features strongly in why members choose to stay online for church-related activities.

In terms of ministering to the aged, survey respondents see potential for PSPC to use digital platforms to facilitate human connection and not to replace the personal touch. Respondents also opined that some elderly may require assistance to use the platforms.

Administering Online Communion

In relation to PSPC's theology and practice of online Communion, there was broad congregational support for the balanced approach adopted by the Session. This approach prioritises in-person Communion while granting special dispensation for online Communion to the sick, homebound and caregivers, alongside home visitation and Communion.

Among the respondents who participated in online Communion, a strong majority (71.9%) found the experience "very beneficial" or "beneficial". They valued not only the sacramental benefits but also the experience of remaining included in the body of Christ. A small percentage (3.3%) described the experience as "unbeneficial" or "very unbeneficial", largely due to their personal preferences for onsite Communion. Around 5 to 10% expressed concern that it might unintentionally foster complacency among able-bodied congregants who can attend in person.

The survey data reflecting the lived experiences of those who partake in online Communion affirms the important step PSPC has taken against ableism, i.e., discrimination in favour of able-bodied people. In this context, ableism would imply that only able-bodied congregants who can come to church may receive Communion, while those who are sick, homebound and caregivers are limited to observing the liturgy via livestream and must wait for home visits to receive Communion. This does not reflect PSPC's vision of the Church. The continued special dispensation for online Communion, in tandem with home Communion, is a digitally enabled means to minister sacramentally to the sick, homebound and caregivers, particularly as Singapore increasingly becomes a super-aged society.

Recommendations

PSPC's posture for a hybrid church model is that digital platforms should serve a supplementary function to interpersonal connection instead of replacing in-person activities. Caution is needed that online channels do not become our default mode of fellowship because of their convenience. In tandem with improvements to digital connectivity, we should, as a church and body of Christ, enhance in-person connection through various means.

While some digital equipping for seniors was carried out during the COVID-19 period, continued digital equipping for seniors may be done where needed. As a supplementary mode of outreach, there is a need for our existing digital platforms to be user-friendly and aesthetically inviting. For this purpose, updating of content and minor improvements to our website's aesthetics and functionality will be explored. Our YouTube live-stream quality will be addressed under the upcoming Building Renewal Project (BRP). We may progressively explore new platforms to use, according to our capacity and intended audience. Finally, the Digital Ministry Team and Pastoral Team wish to thank all respondents who have contributed to the survey. Your responses will help us better minister to the needs of our congregants in this digital age.

REFLECTIONS

Life is full of conversations. How was your reunion dinner? How was your Lunar New Year? What kind of conversations were you having? Was it awkward? Was it fun? Was it intense? Was it deep, or was it just surface conversations?

At my extended family reunion dinner, my aunt came up to me in Hokkien, “Ah Ron, when are you getting a second child?” At that moment, I was stunned. I was surprised that she ever asked me that question. I supposed it was her way of connecting and starting a conversation with me.

“Ah Yi, I am already 45 years old.” I asked her back cheekily, “Ask your daughter to give birth lah, she is only one year older than me.”

And at that reunion dinner, as a big group, we talked about our family, our lives and our children (and her grandchildren), our children’s education, love life and even Korean drama!

I love it whenever we have conversations like these because they remind us that we are human and we are made for conversations. Conversations build us up, help us to remember our roots, pursue each other’s hearts through narratives and seek deeper connections as one.

Words matter; words reveal our hearts. Why we say what we say reveals our hearts. What we say reveals our intentions, and how we say it reveals our true feelings.

Recently, I had a conversation that challenged me to the core. A good friend of mine (who is a non-believer) is working in a big firm in Singapore. He mentioned to me something very disturbing.

He told me, “Bro, I have a boss who is quite abusive to his team. He always takes credit for himself; he doesn’t praise his team who are performing beyond the company’s expectations. He always shared good stuff about himself only. He is not humble and gentle; he always scolds his team, and even in staff meetings, there are a few instances of staff crying.”

My mind was filled with many questions about his boss. Before I could answer any of his questions, my friend told me, “You know the best part of this boss – he is a Christian, he always leaves office earlier on Fridays because he has a cell group at night. He prides himself on being an important member of the church.”

I was speechless, I was humbled, and I felt ashamed of that fellow believer’s behavior and actions. I didn’t know what to say to my friend who was hurt by his boss.

As I was stirring my Kopi C Kosong Peng from Ya Kun, I told my friend, “I am sorry about your bad experience with a Christian. But do you know that no one is perfect, that all of us are sinners, and that we are saved by faith in Christ and by the grace of God?”

To cut a long story short, I went on to explain the gospel to my friend. He appreciated the truth, but he needed more time to consider more about Jesus and the cross.

Recently, I have been reading the letter of James. James chapter 3 challenged me deeply regarding the use of our tongue, which reminded me of the conversation I had with my friend. James 3:5b - 12 reads:

How great a forest is set ablaze by such a small fire! ⁶ And the tongue is a fire, a world of unrighteousness. The tongue is set among our members, staining the whole body, setting on fire the entire course of life, and set on fire by hell. ⁷ For every kind of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by mankind, ⁸ but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. ⁹ **With it we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse people who are made in the likeness of God. ¹⁰ From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers, these things ought not to be so.** ¹¹ Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and salt water? ¹² Can a fig tree, my brothers, bear olives, or a grapevine produce figs? Neither can a salt pond yield fresh water.

James 3 talks about a tongue that is a deadly weapon when it is misused. It has the power to destroy, to curse, and to tear down a person. It will cripple; it will paralyze and even stay in the person's heart and mind for a very long time.

On the other hand, when the tongue is tame and is used in light of the gospel, it has great potential to build up, to offer wise counsel in times of crisis and to strengthen family ties and relationships. All these will lead to the praising of our God.

As we embark on our Building Renewal Project this month, let us commit ourselves to the Lord – to be wise in our words, in how we speak to each other and what we communicate to each other. May everything be done out of love for each other and in love for our God.

May Philippians 4:8 be our guiding principle for our words. Our words matter because they reveal our hearts and thoughts.

⁸ Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.
