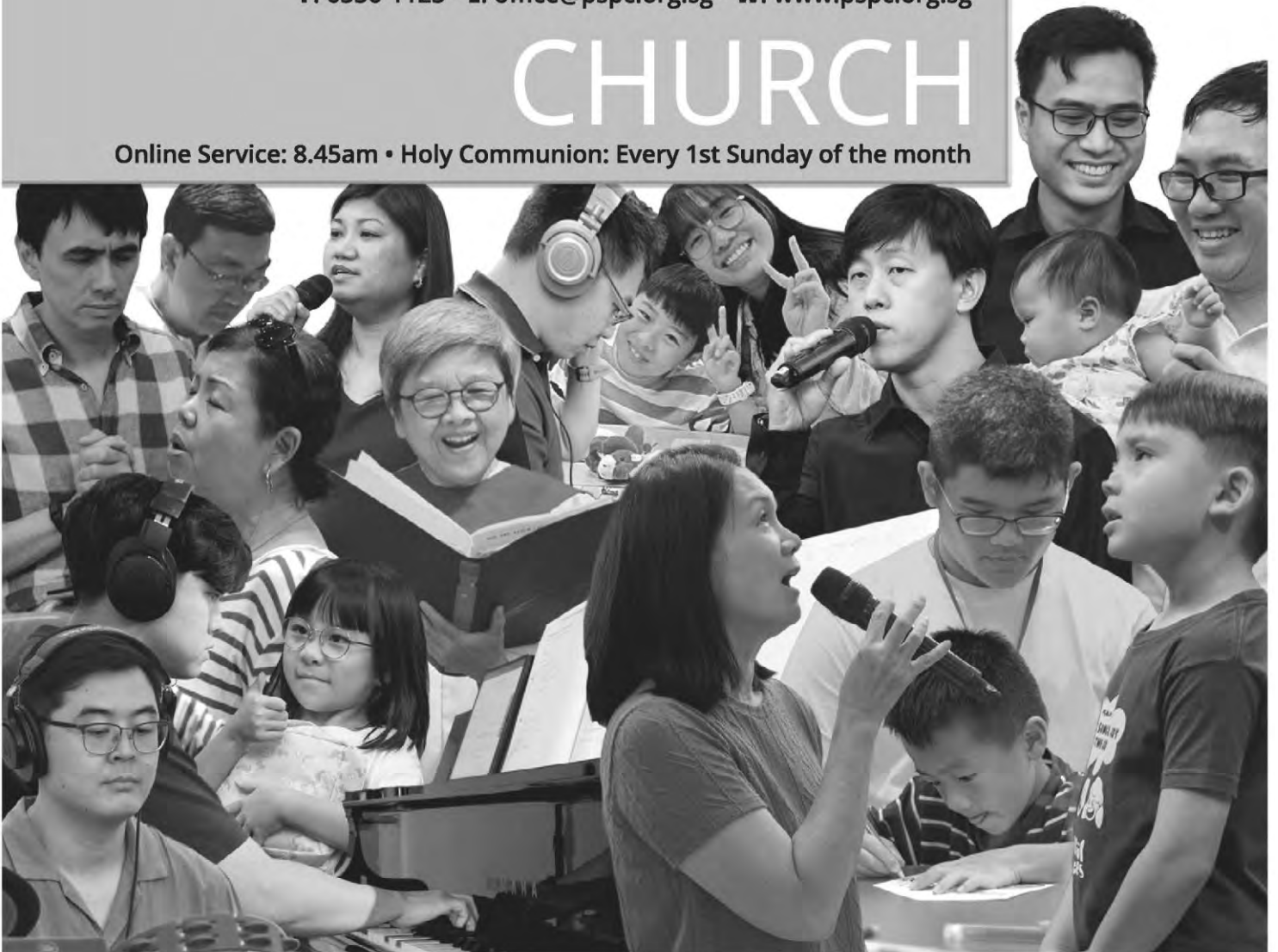

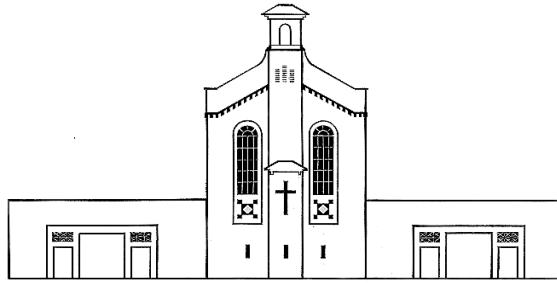

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PRIMARY ONE PHASE 2B APPLICATION EXERCISE

PSPC communicant members who wish to apply for their children to **Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Primary School** or **Pei Hwa Presbyterian Primary School** under the Primary One Phase 2B application exercise are to note the following information.

- a. The Synod Office will notify churches of the annual Phase 2B application exercise, typically in April, with submissions due by mid to late May.
- b. Only “**Active Communicant Members**” are eligible to apply.
- c. An “**Active Communicant Member**” refers to one who has been baptised, confirmed, or transferred into PSPC communicant membership **AND** who has volunteered at least **1 YEAR** of service in PSPC **PRIOR** to the date of application.
- d. Submission of a Phase 2B application does **NOT** guarantee admission to the school.
- e. In the event that the number of applications exceeds the number of vacancies available, places will be allocated by ballot according to the following order of priority:
  1. Singapore Citizens will be given priority over Singapore Permanent Residents, before home-school distance is considered. Applicants may check their home-school distance using this MOE Home-School Distance Checker (<https://www.moe.gov.sg/primary/p1-registration/home-address>).
  2. Children living within 1km of the school.
  3. Children living between 1km and 2km of the school.
  4. Children living outside 2km of the school.
- f. This Phase 2B application exercise is intended for the benefit of “Active Communicant Members”. Parents are still required to register their children under the National Primary One Registration Exercise in July.

## FROM COMMENCEMENT TO CONSECRATION

*“[Being a pastor is] a difficult life because it’s a demanding life. But the rewards are enormous – the rewards of being on the front line of seeing the gospel worked out in people’s life. I remain convinced that if you are called to it, being a pastor is the best life there is.” (Eugene Peterson)*

Last year, as I greeted a congregant entering the sanctuary, she remarked, “*Pastor, next time I call you Doctor.*” Initially caught off guard by her comment, it soon led to a light-hearted exchange about the progress of my Doctor of Ministry (DMin) studies with Fuller Theological Seminary.



Today, I write with deep gratitude to God and to PSPC upon the completion of my studies and the commencement ceremony in Pasadena on 13 June, which I attended with my wife, Angeline. I am thankful for the Session’s endorsement, the ministry support of the Pastoral and Admin Team, the encouragement and prayers of the congregation, and the provision from the Anniversary Seminary Fund. I am also thankful to have completed the programme in time for the ongoing Building Renewal Project (BRP) and my forthcoming appointment as EP Moderator from January 2027.

The DMin is a professional doctorate designed for advanced training that integrates theological reflection with ministry practice within one’s own ministry setting. Alongside the capstone doctoral project on the Reformed ecclesiology and sacramentology of online Communion in a hybrid church model, I completed coursework in ministry practice, Christian leadership, and spiritual formation. One particularly enriching aspect of Fuller’s programme was its international and interdenominational community. I had classmates from around the world, from Japan to the US, who served in diverse contexts beyond pastoral ministry, including missionaries, leaders of Christian NGOs, as well as school, hospital, and military chaplains. Learning alongside fellow students from different backgrounds broadened my perspectives and provided valuable opportunities for reflection and dialogue.

Returning to that earlier comment, “*Pastor, next time I call you Doctor,*” I would say that while “*Doctor*” may be appropriate in formal settings or academic contexts, it does not fully express my vocation within PSPC. My primary calling remains that of pastor, rooted in God’s call, affirmed through the Session, elected by the congregation, and sealed through the rite of ordination. I undertook the DMin for continuing ministerial formation so that I might be further equipped after 19 years of pastoral ministry in PSPC. So, in one sense, nothing has changed – depending on what you have been used to, it is still “*Reverend*”, “*Pastor*”, first name, and even “*Uncle*” (by former PLH youths who are now in their 30s). But in another sense, this commencement flows into consecration for what Eugene Peterson called “*the best life there is.*”

Thank you for your prayers, encouragement, and support throughout this shared journey. From commencement to consecration, may whatever has been gained through these studies serve the building up of God’s people and the glory of His name – *Soli Deo Gloria*.

# MICHELLE CHAU'S COMPLETION OF PRINSEP INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

## Between Dusk and Dawn

My season in the Prinsep Internship Programme (PIP) is fading into dusk, while on the horizon, dawn slowly rises over what awaits at Trinity Theological College in less than a week.
