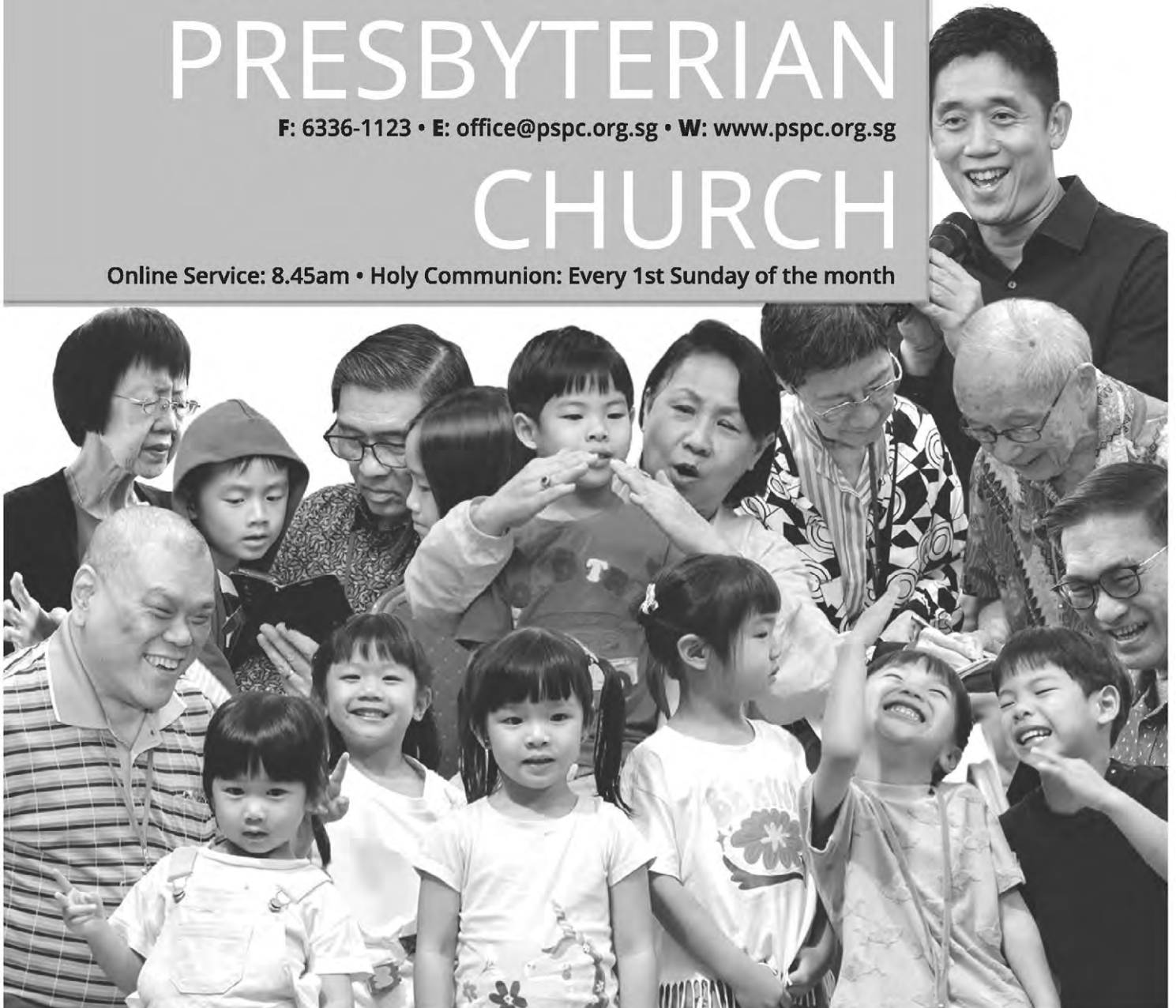

Text : Isaiah 55: 6 - 13

Title : Seed For The Sower And Bread For The Eater

The book of Isaiah was written in a time of war and conflict. Our lives, even in tough times, can be fruitful because God is faithful. He provides seed for the sower and bread for the eater. In God's economy, fruitfulness is not seen in the size of the harvest or the drama of success. Fruitfulness is seen when we are transformed - from thorns to the juniper; from briars to myrtle - so that we can go out with joy and be led forth in peace.

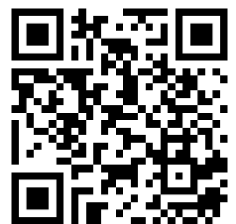

Our Ministry

PCS 145th Anniversary Combined Service (12 July) - We look forward to worshipping God together as a denomination on next Sunday's PCS 145th anniversary combined service at the Singapore Indoor Stadium. We also uphold the Synod organising committee in prayer as they finalise all preparations.

PSPC Missions-in-Focus (MIF) Month - As PSPC begins our MIF month, we pray that the preaching of God's word, missionary sharing as well as ministry initiatives will inspire us to be sent forth as missional people here in Singapore and beyond.

Our Family

Missions - We pray for our missionaries and mission partners who are featured this Sunday:

- **Koh Tse Yuen** - We praise God for Tse Yuen's service in Northern Thailand. We thank God for opening and blessing many doors of ministry opportunity and continue to ask for Him to keep watch over Tse Yuen.
- **Rev Ridge and Connie Orr** - We pray for the Orrs as they reach out to international students in Pittsburgh, USA. We pray for journey mercies as they travel for ministry and family commitments as well as God's leading on the local church where they are serving with.
- **Mizo Christian Fellowship of Singapore (MCFS)** - We pray for our MCFS brothers and sisters as they navigate the adjustments and challenges of overseas work. May God continue to watch over their families amidst the socio-political unrest.

Rev Ron Tan - We convey our well-wishes to Rev Ron Tan as he started ministry at Amazing Grace Presbyterian Church (AGPC) since 1 July. We pray that the Lord will bless his ministry at AGPC.

Peter Lim - We uphold Peter in prayer as he prepares to start radiotherapy in mid July. We pray that he will respond well to the treatment with minimal side effects. We also intercede for Lydia and Sophia as they provide care for him.

Our World

Venezuela Earthquakes - We continue to intercede for Venezuela in the aftermath of the twin earthquakes on 24 June that led to more than 2,300 deaths, 11,000 injured, and 50,000 missing. As search and rescue work ends, we intercede for the authorities and relief agencies as they provide humanitarian supplies for the victims and temporary shelter for the homeless.

FROM COMMENCEMENT TO CONSECRATION

“[Being a pastor is] a difficult life because it’s a demanding life. But the rewards are enormous – the rewards of being on the front line of seeing the gospel worked out in people’s life. I remain convinced that if you are called to it, being a pastor is the best life there is.” (Eugene Peterson)

Last year, as I greeted a congregant entering the sanctuary, she remarked, “*Pastor, next time I call you Doctor.*” Initially caught off guard by her comment, it soon led to a light-hearted exchange about the progress of my Doctor of Ministry (DMin) studies with Fuller Theological Seminary.



Today, I write with deep gratitude to God and to PSPC upon the completion of my studies and the commencement ceremony in Pasadena on 13 June, which I attended with my wife, Angeline. I am thankful for the Session’s endorsement, the ministry support of the Pastoral and Admin Team, the encouragement and prayers of the congregation, and the provision from the Anniversary Seminary Fund. I am also thankful to have completed the programme in time for the ongoing Building Renewal Project (BRP) and my forthcoming appointment as EP Moderator from January 2027.

The DMin is a professional doctorate designed for advanced training that integrates theological reflection with ministry practice within one’s own ministry setting. Alongside the capstone doctoral project on the Reformed ecclesiology and sacramentology of online Communion in a hybrid church model, I completed coursework in ministry practice, Christian leadership, and spiritual formation. One particularly enriching aspect of Fuller’s programme was its international and interdenominational community. I had classmates from around the world, from Japan to the US, who served in diverse contexts beyond pastoral ministry, including missionaries, leaders of Christian NGOs, as well as school, hospital, and military chaplains. Learning alongside fellow students from different backgrounds broadened my perspectives and provided valuable opportunities for reflection and dialogue.

Returning to that earlier comment, “*Pastor, next time I call you Doctor,*” I would say that while “Doctor” may be appropriate in formal settings or academic contexts, it does not fully express my vocation within PSPC. My primary calling remains that of pastor, rooted in God’s call, affirmed through the Session, elected by the congregation, and sealed through the rite of ordination. I undertook the DMin for continuing ministerial formation so that I might be further equipped after 19 years of pastoral ministry in PSPC. So, in one sense, nothing has changed – depending on what you have been used to, it is still “Reverend”, “Pastor”, first name, and even “Uncle” (by former PLH youths who are now in their 30s). But in another sense, this commencement flows into consecration for what Eugene Peterson called “*the best life there is.*”

Thank you for your prayers, encouragement, and support throughout this shared journey. From commencement to consecration, may whatever has been gained through these studies serve the building up of God’s people and the glory of His name – *Soli Deo Gloria.*

MISSIONS SHARING BY MIZO CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP OF SINGAPORE (MCFS)

As PSPC begins our Missions-in-Focus Month, the Pastoral Team and Missions Committee felt led to invite the 2 groups of people who worship God at PSPC on Sunday afternoons, to share about who they are and what they do, so that we may pray for them, who are our brothers and sisters in Christ. Today we feature the Mizo Christian Fellowship of Singapore (MCFS). Our language and custom may be different, but together we worship the one, true, King of kings and Lord of lords, “the One who is, and who was, and who is to come, the Almighty” (Revelation 1:8)

Mizo Christian Fellowship of Singapore (MCFS) is an independent Christian fellowship comprising Mizo believers from India—primarily Mizoram and Manipur—and Myanmar who are living and working in Singapore.

MCFS was established in May 1997 by a group of Mizo students pursuing higher education in Singapore. Founded with the vision of “Service to God and Mankind,” the fellowship was created to provide spiritual support and a sense of community for Mizo Christians in Singapore. Its primary objective is to bring members together for worship in the Mizo language, encourage one another in their faith, and strengthen their walk with God while navigating the challenges of daily life abroad.

Since September 2009, MCFS has been conducting regular worship services at Prinsep Street Presbyterian Church (PSPC). As MCFS is not a registered organisation in Singapore, it faces limitations in appointing a full-time pastor to oversee the fellowship. Nevertheless, through God’s grace, the fellowship has been blessed by the support of Mizo pastors who are pursuing further theological studies in Singapore, visiting pastors, and clergy who assist in administering Holy Communion and providing other pastoral services. In addition, pastors from PSPC occasionally conduct Holy Communion services for MCFS members.

The majority of MCFS members are employed in Singapore, while a smaller number are pursuing their studies. Although an exact membership count is not available, MCFS is estimated to have approximately 1,600 members from various Christian denominations. Around 90% of the members are employed as domestic helpers, while the remaining members work in various professions, including caregiving, nursing, construction, engineering, and other sectors. Given the diverse work schedules and off days, many members face challenges in attending weekly Sunday worship services regularly. Despite these constraints, the average attendance at Sunday worship service is approximately 300 members.

Notwithstanding the challenges and responsibilities associated with work and study, MCFS members continue to demonstrate a strong commitment to missionary outreach. As of 2026, the fellowship provides financial and prayer support to 24 missionaries serving in India and Myanmar, contributing to the advancement of the Gospel and the spiritual and social well-being of the communities they serve.

Prayer Points:

1. For the spiritual and physical well-being of MCFS members as they navigate challenges and responsibilities of living and working abroad.
2. As MCFS members are required to renew their work pass on an annual or biennial basis, please pray for the smooth processing of the necessary administrative paperwork and documentation for work pass renewal.
3. Please keep MCFS members in prayers, seeking God's intervention in the ongoing conflict in the Manipur region of India and in Myanmar, so that all civilians may be blessed with peace, safety, and a better future.
