PSPC TREASURER'S REPORT FOR 1H 2026

We give thanks to God for His abundant blessings upon PSPC. He has faithfully provided for us and enabled us to continue carrying out the work and ministry He has entrusted to us.

In the first half of 2026, PSPC is blessed with total income of \$1.286 million, of which \$1.081 million was from offerings. This is broadly on par with 1H 2025, although offerings were about 7% lower than in the corresponding period last year. Total expenditure for 1H 2026 amounted to \$1.035 million, which is below our forecast expenditure of \$1.33 million for the period. The budgeted expenditure for the full year is \$2.66 million.

We have spent below budget in almost all areas, except in the area of Missions, which is partly due to timing differences. The largest underspend was in Staff Matters, as we are currently operating below our planned staff headcount. We are actively working towards staff recruitment and expect staff-related expenditure to increase in 2H 2026.

As a result, we have a surplus of \$251,000 for 1H 2026. Assuming expenditure proceeds broadly according to plan in 2H 2026, this surplus will be channelled towards Phase 2 of our Building Renewal Project (BRP).

As at the end of 1H 2026, we have liquid funds of \$6.7 million available. We are in a sound financial position to complete BRP Phase 1, which involves the restoration of the Sanctuary. As the cost estimates for BRP Phase 2 become clearer, the EDC will assess whether additional fundraising will be necessary to meet the projected costs.

Please note that this report covers PSPC's regular operational and ministry expenditure and does not include the expenditure relating to BRP. BRP expenditure will be reported separately in the BRP report. As at the end of 1H 2026, there is minimal expenditure on payments to the main contractors.

We have also upgraded our accounting software and are currently monitoring the transition before proceeding with a full migration to the new system, which we aim to complete by the end of 2026. We hope this upgrade will improve the efficiency and resilience of our financial processes. As the new system involves changes to our workflow, particularly in the processing of claims, we ask for congregants' patience and understanding as we work through the transition.

Finally, I would like to thank all our congregants for your faithful and generous giving. Your giving enables PSPC to fulfil our ministry and mission and to be good stewards of the resources God has entrusted to us. I encourage us to continue giving generously and faithfully, trusting in God's continued provision for His work. To God be the glory.

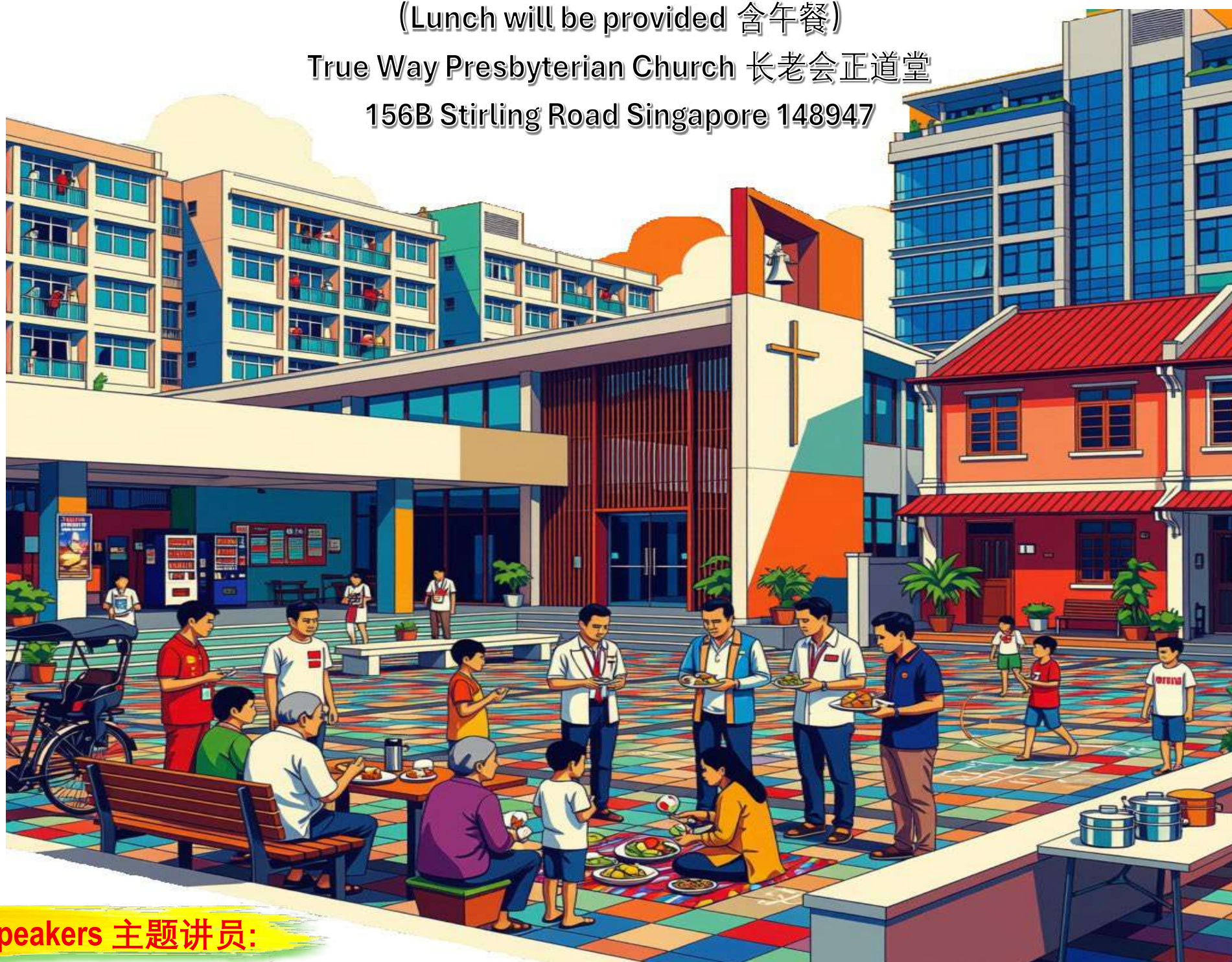

Our World

REFLECTIONS

From Grumpy to Godly

Lately, I've been pondering over this phrase – “Grumpy old man”. Not that I'm getting *that* old or *that* grumpy, but it is good to have some self-reflection from time to time.

Why grumpy old man? Is it a norm, to be expected, that when a person grows older, he (or she, I'm not letting the ladies get away with this...) gets grumpy, annoyed and irritated more easily? There are contributing factors. While ageing does not automatically make someone irritable, the physical, emotional, and social changes can make one more prone to frustration, impatience, or moodiness, i.e., grumpy.

1. Physical Limitations

I feel this most acutely. I used to love running, but it has become rather challenging to go on long runs. So walks and treks have taken the place of runs. Not too long ago, I was able to skip up 3 flights of stairs, now I have to conquer them with steady pace. What I was able to do without difficulty some years ago has become somewhat tedious.

2. Health

As one ages, health issues will naturally increase. The worry of contracting a major illness grows. Age-related health problems such as arthritis, chronic pain, reduced mobility, hearing or vision difficulties can make everyday activities more challenging. Small injuries that used to take days or weeks to heal now takes months. Constant discomfort and worry can affect a person's patience and mood.

3. A Fast-Changing World

As the saying goes, “The only constant in life is change” (Of course we know that our God is the same yesterday, today and forever). Today, things are moving faster than ever – technology, social norms, the vast amount of information flow, the way we transact and even the way we communicate. It's all a bit *sus*.

The rapid pace of modern life may be a bit too much for someone who is slowing down in life. Now, one needs to remember 101 passwords and be able to manoeuvre QR codes and apps. What he used to know as norm has been overtaken by new etiquettes. What was considered strange is now totally accepted and what was considered polite may now be construed as silly.

4. Being Valued

Due to one's age, experience and wisdom, there may be an expectation to be accorded a certain amount of respect and courtesy. After decades of building a career, raising a family, overcoming life's challenges, one naturally feels that he still has much to offer. But in a fast-

changing world with new technology and innovations, new social norms and attitudes, such experience and wisdom may be ignored as irrelevant. Wounded pride may possibly express itself as grumpiness.

My simple ABC to remind myself how not to be a grumpy old man:

A – Don't be Angry. Be Appreciative.

B – Don't be Bossy. Be Benevolent.

C – Don't Complain. Give Compliments.

But I believe that the 'grumpy old man' syndrome should not be applicable to the Christian, for the simple reason the longer a person is in Christ, the more he should be displaying the fruit of the Spirit in his life: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law." (Galatians 5:22-23)

The longer a person has journeyed with the Lord, his relationship with his heavenly Father should be growing closer and more intimate. The Scripture exalts us to be growing "in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18) and that we should be "possessing these qualities (faith, knowledge, self-control, steadfastness, godliness, love) in *increasing measures*" as good witnesses for Christ (2 Peter 1:5-8). Simply put, the longer a person is a Christian, the more Christlike he should be.

Of course we will still face the many challenges of ageing, but we do not face them as one who is without God. The Lord is our very present help in our times of need. We must remember that our identity is in Christ, not in our abilities or achievements. We must learn to trust the Lord to help us adapt and cope with the changes and to trust Him with our worries. We must learn to be contented, even with rejoicing, in our shortcomings and limitations.

So rather than becoming a Grumpy Old Man, I say we must grow to be Godly Old Men (and Women)! That means that as we mature in Christ, we need to set the example in godliness, holiness and prayerfulness, in faith, trust and obedience. To lead the way in being gracious in all things, showing kindness and goodness when none is deserved. To live out joy, faithfulness, gratitude, contentment, self-control and "all that tends towards a true Christian manliness", to quote from the Object of the Boys' Brigade.

Titus 2:2-4 encourages the older Christians to set the example and to instruct the younger ones: "Older men are to be sober-minded, dignified, self-controlled, sound in faith, in love and in steadfastness. Older women likewise are to be reverent in behaviour, not slanderers or slaves to much wine. They are to teach what is good and so train the young women to love their husbands and children..."

As we focus on being a "Godly Old Man" rather than "Grumpy Old Man", our greatest legacy is not in the years lived, but in the years of growing in Christ and the kind of person we become.
