The PLH will be in recess on 14 June (Church Camp), 21 June (School Term Break), and 28 June (Youth Sunday).

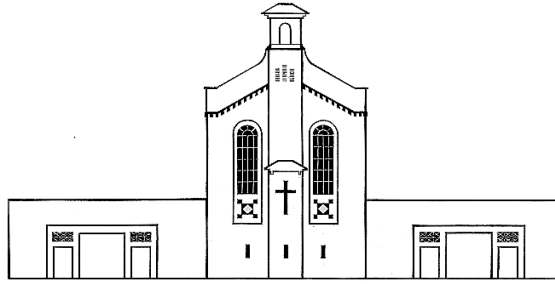

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PRIMARY ONE PHASE 2B APPLICATION EXERCISE

PSPC communicant members who wish to apply for their children to **Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Primary School** or **Pei Hwa Presbyterian Primary School** under the Primary One Phase 2B application exercise are to note the following information.

- a. The Synod Office will notify churches of the annual Phase 2B application exercise, typically in April, with submissions due by mid to late May.
- b. Only “**Active Communicant Members**” are eligible to apply.
- c. An “**Active Communicant Member**” refers to one who has been baptised, confirmed, or transferred into PSPC communicant membership **AND** who has volunteered at least **1 YEAR** of service in PSPC **PRIOR** to the date of application.
- d. Submission of a Phase 2B application does **NOT** guarantee admission to the school.
- e. In the event that the number of applications exceeds the number of vacancies available, places will be allocated by ballot according to the following order of priority:
 1. Singapore Citizens will be given priority over Singapore Permanent Residents, before home-school distance is considered. Applicants may check their home-school distance using this MOE Home-School Distance Checker (<https://www.moe.gov.sg/primary/p1-registration/home-address>).
 2. Children living within 1km of the school.
 3. Children living between 1km and 2km of the school.
 4. Children living outside 2km of the school.
- f. This Phase 2B application exercise is intended for the benefit of “Active Communicant Members”. Parents are still required to register their children under the National Primary One Registration Exercise in July.

REFLECTIONS

Stepping Out in Faith: A Journey of Trust and Provision

As an elder of PSPC, I often reflect on what it truly means to live a life defined by faith. Is faith merely a quiet conviction we hold in our hearts, or is it a dynamic, active trust that moves our feet? The scriptures teach us that faith is inherently active. It requires us to step out into the unknown, fully relying on the character and promises of God.

When we look at the Old Testament, we see this beautifully illustrated in the life of Abraham. In Genesis 12:1, the Lord tells him, “Go from your country and your kindred and your father’s house to the land that I will show you.” Abraham did not receive a detailed map or a guarantee of easy travel. He simply received a command and a promise. Hebrews 11:8 reminds us of his radical obedience: “By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going.” Abraham’s faith was not the absence of uncertainty; it was the presence of trust in the One who called him.

In the New Testament, we see this same call to radical trust when Jesus invites His disciples into ministry. In Matthew 10:9-10, as He sends them out to preach the Kingdom, He instructs them, “Acquire no gold nor silver nor copper for your belts, no bag for your journey, nor two tunics, nor sandals, nor a staff, for the labourer deserves his food.” Jesus was teaching His disciples a foundational Kingdom principle: when you are on God’s mission, you must rely entirely on God’s provision. God sustained these disciples on the dusty roads of Galilee by shifting their dependence away from physical safety nets, miraculously moving the hearts of strangers to provide them with daily food and shelter, while equipping them with supernatural strength and authority to do His work.

For the past sixteen years, our congregation has had the profound privilege of putting these biblical principles into practice. Since 2009, I have been organising our yearly short-term mission trips to Thailand. Every single year, as we begin the planning phases, the same human questions inevitably arise: *Will we have enough volunteers? Will we raise enough funds to cover the heavy expenses of travel and ministry materials?* Every year, I am forced to practice what I preach — to model the very trust and faith that Abraham and the early disciples displayed. And every year, from 2009 all the way through our most recent trip in 2025, our Jehovah-Jireh — the Lord Our Provider — has shown Himself faithful.

Through your incredible generosity, your prayers, and your willingness to sacrifice your time, God has miraculously provided 100% of the financial resources needed to meet every single trip expense, including scholarships for needy Thai students. Moreover, He has raised up the exact manpower required to carry out every ministry activity we set out to do. I am filled with overwhelming gratitude for how this church community has linked arms with me to execute His work.

Those of you who have joined me on these trips to Thailand have seen this faith modelled firsthand. You have walked with me through the anxious moments of preparation, and you have stood with me in awe as the resources poured in. We did not rely on our own clever fundraising schemes or strategic planning; we relied on the living God.

Our God is the same yesterday, today, and forever. If He can guide Abraham to an unknown land, if He can sustain the disciples on the roads of Galilee by moving hearts to meet their daily needs, and if He can faithfully fund and populate our Thailand mission trips for nearly two decades, He can certainly be trusted with whatever unknown path that lies before you today.

Let us continue to step out of our comfort zones, confident in the truth of Proverbs 3:5-6: “Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.”
